## **MARINE NOTICE 210.5**

To: ALL SHIPOWNERS, MANAGERS, MASTERS, REGISTRATION OFFICERS OF

MERCHANT SHIPS AND RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATIONS

REQUIREMENTS FOR OFFICERS' CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY BY Subject:

**EXAMINATION AND TRAINING** 

This document is addressed to ship owners, ship managers and seafarers as to requirements established by the Administration for eligibility of seafarers to take examinations for certification as required by the STCW Convention as amended and Code, in order to serve on ships that are registered under the Palau's International Ship Registry.

It is not intended to substitute Admiralty and Maritime Act or the STCW Regulations 2017.

### 1. AUTHORITY

1.1. Issuance of Certificates, Documents and Examinations

The Palau International Ship Registry is authorized to issue certificates and documents on behalf of the Administration to all merchant marine personnel serving on vessels that are registered under Palau's International Ship Registry.

The Bureau of Commercial Development is authorized to issue certificates and documents on behalf of the Administration to all merchant marine personnel serving on vessels that are registered under Palau's Domestic Ship Registry.


### 1.2. Establishment of Standards

The Administration is authorized to establish such standards as are necessary and proper for certificating and up-grading of merchant marine personnel and for the maintenance of high standards in the Administration's Merchant Marine.

1.3. Compliance with the STCW Convention, 1978, as amended

The standards established pursuant to Item 1.2 above have been revised herein to comply fully with the provisions of the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, 1978, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "STCW"). The term "as amended" is construed to mean that all amendments up to the present, included the Manilla Amendments, are included.









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### 1.4. Evaluation of Uncategorized Qualifications

In cases where a candidate for examination has acquired qualifications, service, experience and/or training that does not meet these specific requirements, but which, in the opinion of the candidate is reasonably equivalent thereto, such documentary evidence of reasonably equivalent qualifications, etc., may be submitted to PISR or the Bureau of Commercial Development, as applicable, for evaluation. The decision of PISR or the Bureau of Commercial Development, as applicable, in all such cases shall be final.

### 2. GENERAL

### 2.1. Definitions

For these requirements, the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to

- Administration means the Ministry of Public Infrastructure, Industries and Commerce .1 of the Republic of Palau;
- Approved means approved by or on behalf of the Ministry of Public Infrastructure, .2 Industries and Commerce of the Republic of Palau in accordance with the Admiralty
  - Maritime Act or the STCW Regulations;
- .3 Assistant engineer officer means a person under training to become an engineer officer and designated as such by national law or regulations;
- Ballast Control Operator (BCO) means the person assigned responsibility for the .4 normal day-to-day control of trim, draught and stability;
- .5 Barge Supervisor (BS) means a person who may provide support to the offshore installation manager (OIM) in certain essential marine matters. The barge supervisor on some MOUs may be referred to as the stability section leader, barge engineer or barge master;
- Certificate of Competency (CoC) means a certificate issued and endorsed for .6 masters, officers and GMDSS radio operators in accordance with the provisions of chapters II, III, IV or VII of STCW and entitling the lawful holder thereof to serve in the capacity and perform the functions involved at the level of responsibility specified
- Certificate of Endorsement (CoE) means a certificate issued for Masters, officers or .7 GMDSS radio operators who hold an appropriate and valid CoC issued by a recognized maritime administration in accordance with STCW Regulation I/10 (Recognition of Certificates);
- Certificate of Proficiency (CoP) means a certificate, other than a CoC or CoE, issued .8 to a seafarer, stating that the relevant requirements of training, competencies or seagoing service in STCW have been met;
- .9 Chief engineer officer means the senior engineer officer responsible for the









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mechanical propulsion and the operation and maintenance of the mechanical and electrical installations of the vessel;

- Chief mate means the officer next in rank to the master and upon whom the .10 command of the vessel will fall in the event of the incapacity of the master;
- Deck Officer (or Officer in Charge of a Navigation Watch (OICNW) means an officer .11 qualified in accordance with the provisions of Chapter II of STCW;
- Mobile Offshore Unit (MOU) means any mobile offshore structure or vessel, whether .12 designed for operation afloat or supported by the seabed
- Documentary evidence means documentation, other than a CoC, CoE or CoP, used .13 to establish that the relevant requirements of STCW have been met;
- Engineer Officer (or Officer in Charge of an Engineering Watch (OICEW) means an .14 officer qualified in accordance with the provisions of regulation III/1, III/2 or III/3 of
- Function means a group of tasks, duties and responsibilities, as specified in STCW, .15 necessary for vessel operation, safety of life at sea or protection of the marine environment:
- Maintenance supervisor (MS) means the person assigned responsibility for the .16 inspection, operation and testing, as required, of all machinery and equipment as specified by the owner of the MOU. The maintenance supervisor on some MOUs may also be referred to as the chief engineer, technical section leader or rig mechanic;
- .17 *Master* means the person having command of a vessel;
- .18 Month means a calendar month.
- .19 Officer means a member of the crew, other than the master, designated as such by national law or regulations or, in the absence of such designation, by collective agreement or custom;
- Offshore installation manager (OIM) means a competent person, certified in .20 accordance with these recommendations, who has been appointed in writing by the company to manage the offshore activities of the MOU;
- .21 Regulations means regulations contained in the annex to STCW Convention as amended:
- Seagoing service means service on board a vessel relevant to the requirements for .22 the issue or revalidation of a certificate or other qualification;
- .23 Second engineer officer means the engineer officer next in rank to the chief engineer officer and upon whom the responsibility for the mechanical propulsion and the operation and maintenance of the mechanical and electrical installations of the vessel will fall in the event of the incapacity of the chief engineer officer; and
- STCW means the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification .24 and watch keeping for seafarers, as amended, including the Manila Amendments to the Convention and any future amendments approved by the Administration.









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## 2.2. Form of Application

## Application for Officers Certificates of Competency (ANNEX I)

An Application shall be submitted accompanied by supporting documentation in accordance with part VIII.

### 2.3. Form of Certificate

### Certificate of Competency (ANNEX II)

Each candidate for an officer certificate who qualifies under the provisions of STCW and successfully completes the appropriate examination will be issued a Certificate of Competency.

This certificate states that the officer has been found duly qualified in accordance with the provisions of STCW and in the format prescribed by STCW for those officers qualified to receive STCW certificates. References will not appear on non-STCW certificates.

### 2.4. STCW Certificate Format

The STCW Certificate specifies the "functions" for which the officer is qualified and the "level of responsibility" as follows:

### **Functions**

The abilities specified in the standards of competency are grouped as appropriate under the following seven functions:

- .1 Navigation
- .2 Cargo handling and stowage
- .3 Controlling the operation of the vessel and care for persons on board
- .4 Marine engineering
- .5 Electrical, electronic and control engineering
- .6 Maintenance and repair
- .7 Radio communications

### Levels of Responsibility

The levels of responsibility are specified as follows:

.1 Management level:

Master **Chief Mate** Chief Engineer Second Engineer Officer









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.2 Operational level:

Officer in Charge of Navigational Watch (OICNW) Officer in Charge of Engine Watch (OICEW)

.3 Support level:

All seafarers performing assigned tasks, duties or responsibilities on board a seagoing ship under the direction of an individual serving in the operational or management level.

### 2.5. Officer Qualifications for STCW Certification

- .1 Each Deck/Navigational Officer must qualify in functions 1, 2 and 3 (deck) and 7.
- .2 Each engineer officer must qualify in functions 3 (engineer), 4, 5, and 6.

### 2.6. Non-STCW Certificates

Non-STCW Certificates are issued to officers in the Offshore Oil Industry and do not specify "functions" for which the officer qualified as do the STCW Certificates. They do indicate "levels of responsibility" as follows:

Levels of Responsibility

At the following levels of responsibility:

.1 Management level -

Oil Installation Manager (OIM) Maintenance Supervisor (MS)

.2 Operational level -

Barge Supervisor (BS) Ballast Control Operator (BCO) Assistant Maintenance Supervisor (AMS)

### 2.7. Fees

### 2.7.1. **Schedule**

Any candidate for certificate of competency must remit the required fee to Palau International Ship Registry. This fee is non-refundable and must be paid at the time of application in accordance with relevant instructions of the Invoice issued by Palau International Ship Registry.









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### 2.8. Fraud, Forgery, Misrepresentation or Attempted Bribery

- Any person who submits a fraudulent application for examination for a Certificate, or who makes misrepresentations in or about an application, or who attempts to bribe or subvert any person charged with the approval of applications and/or conduct of examinations shall be denied his/her application and shall forfeit any application fees paid to PISR and may be subject to criminal prosecution. In addition to any criminal penalties that may be imposed, the person shall be forbidden to reapply for a period of not less than two (2) years.
- 2.8.2. Each individual candidate who willfully submits forged, altered, fraudulent or fraudulently obtained documentation of qualification about an application for a certificate of Competency will, in addition to any criminal penalties, be subject to an administrative penalty of USD 500.00 and may be barred from holding any PISR-issued Certificate or Seafarer's Employment Record Book (ERB) for a period not to exceed two (2) years.
- 2.8.3. Any ship-owner or agent who submits, on behalf of a candidate, an application for an examination for a Certificate that contains a willful misstatement of fact or references a document that is forged, altered, fraudulent or fraudulently obtained and the truth or genuineness of which is known or capable of being determined by the submitting party will be subject to an administrative penalty of USD 500.00. Further submissions from such source may be barred for a period not to exceed two (2) years.

#### 2.9 **General Requirements for Examination Approval**

#### 2.9.1 Age:

Candidates for officer's certificates by examination & training shall not be approved for any person who is under 18 years of age. Approvals for certification by examination & training for the grades of Chief Mate, First Assistant Engineer or higher shall not be issued to any person under 21 years of age. A candidate shall be required to submit satisfactory proof of age by means of a passport, birth certificate, certificate of naturalization or other acceptable proof of birth date.

#### 2.9.2 Citizenship and Residency:

A candidate for an examination may be of any nationality and need not to be a citizen or resident of the Republic of Palau

#### 2.9.3 **Medical Examination**

.1 Every candidate for an examination shall be required to submit satisfactory evidence of a medical examination completed by an approved medical examiner within the 24 months immediately preceding application. The report of the examination shall establish that the candidate is in good physical condition and in possession of all









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the body faculties necessary to fulfill the requirements of the seafaring profession. The report and certificate of medical examination shall be completed on the official Medical Examination Form PISR FORM (ANNEX III) or acceptable equivalent. The medical certificate must comply with the requirements of STCW, Regulation I/9 and Section A-I/9 paragraph 7. The report / form must be signed by both the medical examiner and the examinee. If the report is in the form of an acceptable equivalent, it shall comply with the requirements of STCW Regulation I/9 and STCW Section A-I/9 in its content and specifically shall state that the seafarer is fit for duty as a seafarer.

#### 2.9.4 Photograph

Every candidate for a PISR-issued Certificate shall submit one photograph, 1¾" x 1¾" (45mm x 45mm) in size, of himself or herself, taken within the twelve (12) months preceding the date of application. The photograph must show a facial front view of the candidate without any head gear.

- 2.9.5 Every candidate for an examination for a deck officer's certificate must submit proof of successful completion of the below STCW courses, approved by PISR Administration:
- 2.9.6 **Upgrades to National Certificates**

A candidate who is certificated by another Administration whose the national Certificates of Competency (CoC) are recognized by PISR, can apply for an equivalent or upgrade to the next higher capacity by qualifying for such a CoC and successful completion of an examination for that capacity.

### .1 Experience

In order to qualify for an equivalent or upgrading of an officer's certificate, a candidate for an examination, as directed in section 3.1, must provide proof of at least 12 months of experience in the capacity of his nationally issued CoC.

#### 3.0 **EXAMINATION & TRAINING FOR OFFICERS CERTIFICATES**

3.1 The examination may be administered by a third party who is approved by the Administration to offer the course and examination on their behalf.

#### 3.2 **Persons Who Are Eligible**

A person who is not certificated or who desires to upgrade any certificate presently held may apply to sit for an examination in the appropriate grade, provided such person is otherwise eligible in accordance with 3.2.









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The examination may be administered by a third party who is approved by the Administration to offer the course and examination on their behalf.

#### 3.3 **Requirements for Deck Officers**

3.3.1 Officer in Charge of Navigational Watch (OICNW) on ships of 500 gross tonnage or more.

Eligibility for OICNW is defined in STCW Regulation II/1. This certification will be issued by the Administration as OICNW. To be approved for an examination, the candidate:

- .1 Must be not less than 18 years of age.
- .2 Must have attained qualifying sea service of not less than 36 months in the deck department of foreign going trading vessels of 500 GT or more in the capacity of Trainee Seafarer, Seafarer, Quartermaster, Boatswain, Cadet or any similar deck related capacity twelve months of which shall be recorded in an onboard Training Record Book and twenty-four (24) months of which must have been served as an Able Seafarer. Services performed in peripheral duties such as Radio Officer, Purser, Ship's Clerk, Cook, Steward, Mess man, Cabin boy, etc., are not acceptable as part of qualifying service. The decision of the Administration as to qualifying sea time will be final.
- .3 Can, in lieu of .2 above, substitute education for sea time on a day for day basis up to 24 months as follows:
  - 1. Attendance to a maritime academy that prepares seafarers to become deck officers.
  - 2. The possession of a Bachelor of Science degree in Navigation, Marine Transportation or any other equivalent.
  - 3. Attendance at an approved Competency Course for deck officers.
  - 4. Must provide evidence that he/she has met the requirements of STCW Regulation II/1 and the competencies listed in Table A-II/1.
  - 5. Must provide evidence of successful completion of all necessary approved mandatory modular courses, including:
    - Basic Safety Training
    - Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boats other than Fast Rescue Boats (PSCRB)
    - Medical First Aid (MFA)
    - Advanced Fire Fighting (AFF)
    - Radar Observrvation
    - Automated Radar Plotting Aid (ARPA)
    - Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS)
    - Bridge Resource Management (BRM)









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ISO 37001

- Leadership and Teamwork training
- Global Maritime Distress Safety System General Operator Certificate (GMDSS GOC)
- Ship Security Training
- Marine Environmental Awareness
- 6. Must demonstrate a good command of spoken and written English.
- 7. Must present a Medical Examination report that complies with paragraph 2.9.3. from an approved medical examiner where the examination was performed within the two (2) years prior to the date of the application.
- 8. Must present a Seafarer Identification and Record Book (SIRB) that has been validated by the national maritime administration that issued the book or a Continuous Discharge Certificate (CDC), as proof of sea service.
- 9. Must present a valid passport as proof of identity and nationality.
- Chief Mate on ships of 500 gross tonnage or more. 3.3.2

While holding an PISR Certificate as OICNW, or a CoC issued by another administration whose the national Certificates of Competency (CoC) are recognized by PISR in equivalent grade a candidate for this examination must provide evidence of:

- at least one (1) year of service as OICNW on ships relevant to his certificate; and
- Attendance of approved training to meet the requirements of the STCW Code Section A-II/2 including:
  - Advanced Meteorology
  - Advanced Navigation
  - Advance Ship Handling
  - Advanced Stability
  - International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code
  - International Maritime Solid Bulk Cargoes Code (IMSBC)
  - International Aeronautical and Maritime Search and Rescue Manual (IAMSAR)
  - Leadership
  - Managerial training
- 3.3.3 Master on ships of 500 gross tonnage or more.

While holding a PISR Certificate as Chief Mate on ships of 500 gross tonnage or more, or a CoC issued by another administration whose the national Certificates of Competency (CoC) are recognized by PISR in equivalent grade a candidate for this examination must provide evidence of:



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- 1. at least one (1) year of service as Chief Mate on ships relevant to his certificate; or
- 2. at least two (3) years of service as OICNW on ships relevant to his certificate
- 3. All the required training for Chief Mate in paragraph 3.3.2. above, including Leadership and Teamwork training
- Officer in Charge of Navigational Watch (OICNW) on ships of less than 500 gross tonnage, 3.3.4 including commercial yachts of less than 200 gross tonnage:
  - 1. Eligibility for OICNW on ships of less than 500 gross tonnage is defined in STCW Regulation II/3. This certification will be issued by the Administration as OICNW. Candidates for this examination must meet the following requirements.

To become approved for an examination, the candidate:

- a. Must be not less than 18 years of age.
- b. Must have attained qualifying sea service of not less than 36 months in the deck department of trading vessels or commercial yachts in the capacity of Trainee Seafarer, Seafarer, Quartermaster, Boatswain, Cadet or any similar deck related capacity one year of which shall be recorded in an onboard Training Record Book and two (2) years of which must have been served as an Able Seafarer. Services performed in peripheral duties such as Radio Officer, Purser, Ship's Clerk, Cook, Steward, Mess man, Cabin boy, etc., are not acceptable as part of qualifying service. The decision of the Administration as to qualifying sea time will be final.

Can, in lieu of b. above, substitute education for sea time on a day for day basis up to 24 months as follows:

- .1 Attendance to a maritime academy that prepares seafarers to become deck officers.
- The possession of a Bachelor of Science degree in Navigation, Marine .2 Transportation or any other equivalent.
- Attendance at an approved Competency Course for deck officers. .3
- Must provide evidence that he/she has met the requirements of STCW .4 Regulation II/3 and the competencies listed in Table A-II/3.
- Must provide evidence of completion of all necessary approved mandatory .5 modular courses, including:
  - **Basic Safety Training**
  - Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boats other than Fast Rescue Boats (PSCRB)
  - Medical First Aid (MFA)
  - Advanced Fire Fighting (AFF)
  - Radar Obserrvation









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- Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS), for those who serve on ships fitted with ECDIS.
- Bridge Resource Management (BRM)
- Leadership and Teamwork training
- Appropriate certificate for performing VHF radiocommunications in accordance with the requirements of the Radio Regulations
- Security Training
- Marine Environmental Awareness
- Must demonstrate a good command of spoken and written English. .6
- .7 Must present a Medical Examination report that complies with paragraph 2.9.3. above from an approved medical examiner where the examination was performed within the two (2) years prior to the date of the application.
- .8 Must present a Seafarer Identification and Record Book (SIRB) that has been validated by the national maritime administration that issued the book as proof of sea service.
- .9 Must present a valid passport as proof of identity and nationality.
- 2. Every candidate for certification as chief mate or master on ships of less than 500 gross tonnage, engaged on near-coastal voyages, while holding an PISR Certificate as OICNW, or a CoC in equivalent grade issued by another administration which this Administration recognizes, he(she) for this examination must provide evidence of:
  - at least one (1) year of service as OICNW; and
  - All the required training for OICNW in paragraph 3.2.4.5 above except for the Leadership and Teamwork training. In lieu of this Advanced Meteorology, Leadership and Managerial training is required.

#### 3.3.5 Yacht Master

.1 Master (Yacht) - 350gt, Mate (Yacht) - 200gt plus

Candidates must first complete an approved course. All candidates must be approved by the Administration as eligible to take the examination. Candidates may attend a course without prior approval; however, a candidate cannot sit for examination unless so approved by the Administration as so qualified.

Candidates for this examination, in addition to the requirements in 2.6. above must be in possession of a valid CoC for a yacht master limited to vessels of not more than 200 gt This certificate will be an upgrade to that CoC.

For an applicant to be approved for this PISR examination the following requirements must be met:

1. The applicant must possess a valid CoC for 200 gt Master - Yachts (or greater);









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
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- 2. The applicant must have completed three (3) years' service on vessels greater than 15 meters, one (1) year (365 days) of which must be aboard a vessel greater than 200 gross tons in the grade of Master or Mate (OICNW, OOW, Chief Mate):
- 3. The applicant must have completed the following courses:
  - STCW Basic Safety Training (all four (4) parts)
  - Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boats except for Fast Rescue Boats
  - Master of Yachts 200 Tons Unlimited Oceans
  - **OOW Navigation and Radar**
  - General Ships Knowledge
  - Advanced Sea Survival for Yachtsmen
  - Advanced Firefighting
  - Medical First Aid
  - Radar Observer
  - **ARPA**
  - Security Awareness Training
  - Bridge Resource Management
  - Leadership and Managerial training
  - ECDIS (40-hour course) \*\*
  - Marine Environmental Awareness
- 4. The applicant must possess either a GMDSS operator's certificate or certificate from an approved training course for GMDSS operator that complies with STCW Regulation IV/2:
- 5. The applicant must provide a medical examination report that complies with paragraph 2.9.3.;
- 6. The applicant must provide a copy of a valid passport;
- 7. The applicant must provide (1) good quality passport size photo; and
- 8. The applicant must possess an PISR/SIRB or apply for same.
- .2 Master (Yacht) - Mate (Yacht) - Unlimited

Candidates before taking the examination must first qualify for and complete an approved course. All candidates must first be approved by the Administration as eligible to take the examination. Candidates may attend a course without prior approval; however, a candidate cannot sit for the examination unless he (she) is approved by the Administration as so qualified.

> Candidates for this examination, in addition to the requirements in 2.9. above must be in possession of a valid CoC as outlined in 3.2.5.2.1 above; The present certificate will be an upgrade to that CoC.









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To be approved for this PISR examination the following requirements must be met:

- 1. The applicant must possess a valid STCW CoC for either:
  - a.) STCW II/2 Master Yachts not more than 3000 GT (or greater), or
  - b.) STCW II/2 Master Vessels not more than 3000 GT (or greater)
- 2. The applicant must have completed one (1) year of sea service within the last five (5) years as follows:
  - Holders of a vacht CoC must show service aboard a vessel greater than 500 gt in the grade of Master, 270 days of which must be actual sea service
  - Holders of a commercial vessel CoC must show service aboard a vessel greater than 500 gt in the grade of Master, 180 days of which must be actual sea service; or be qualified to sit for an STCW Master (Unlimited) examination.
- 3. The applicant must have completed the following courses:
  - STCW Basic Safety Training (refresher)
  - Advanced Firefighting
  - Medical First Aid
  - Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boat other than Fast Rescue Boat
  - Advanced Meteorology
  - Advanced Navigation
  - Advance Ship Handling
  - **Advanced Stability**
  - ARPA
  - Bridge Resource Management (BRM)
  - **Celestial Navigation**
  - Electronic Chart Display and Information Systems (ECDIS) 40hr course\*\*
  - Leadership and Managerial
  - Marine Propulsion for the Deck Officer
  - **Security Awareness**
- 4. The possession of either a GMDSS operator's certificate or certificate from an approved training course for GMDSS operator that complies with STCW Regulation IV/2.
  - 1. The applicant must provide a medical examination report
  - 2. The applicant must provide a valid passport;
  - 3. The Applicant must provide a good quality passport size photograph; and
  - 4. The applicant must possess a PISR Seafarers Identification and Record Book or apply for the same.









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#### 3.3.6 Certificated Service

Where certificated service is required in establishing eligibility, such service must have been completed while holding a current and valid certificate.

#### 3.3.7 Tonnage

Certificates issued pursuant to above shall be valid for service on vessels of any gross tonnage unless adequate service upon vessels over 3000 gross tons is not met. The issued CoC may then carry a tonnage restriction.

#### 3.4 Requirements for Engineer Officer Steam and/or Motor Examinations & Training

#### 3.4.1 All Engineering Officer Grades

The examination may be administered by a third party who is approved by the Administration to offer the course and examination on their behalf.

All applicants for Engineering Officer examinations must provide evidence of having completed:

- .1 STCW Basic Safety Training (refresher)
- .2 Advanced Firefighting
- .3 Medical First Aid
- .4 Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boat other than Fast Rescue Boat
- .5 Security Awareness Training;
- .6 Engine Resource Management training;
- .7 Leadership and Teamwork/Managerial training; and
- .8 Training in High voltage systems if no evidence of training in high voltage systems can be provided, the certificate will be limited to vessels not equipped with high voltage systems (1000 V or more).


#### 3.4.2 All Grades - Motor

A certificate issued pursuant to section 3.4 may be limited as to the power rating of main propulsion machinery. Service shall have been aboard motor vessels of over 3000 kW propulsion power. At least one (1) year of the total service required shall have been within five (5) years preceding the date of application. At least six (6) months of the total service required shall at some times have been served on motordriven vessels.

#### Officer in Charge of an Engineering Watch (OICEW) 3.4.3

Eligibility for OICEW - Third Engineer (Fourth Engineer Officer) is defined in the STCW Code, Regulation III/1, which will be issued by the Administration as OICEW -











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Third Assistant Engineer (Fourth Engineer Officer) for original first-time engineering officers. Candidates must qualify for the examination as outlined below.

To qualify, the candidate:

- .1 Must be not less than 18 years of age.
- .2 Must have attained qualifying sea service of not less thirty-six (36) months in the engine department of foreign going trading vessels of 750 kW or more in the capacity of any watch standing engine rating, electrician, electro-technical officer or electro-technical rating. Twelve (12) months of which shall be recorded in an onboard Training Record Book.
- .3 Can, in lieu of .2 above, substitute training on a day for day basis up to 24 months for sea time as follows:
  - .1 Attendance to a maritime academy that prepares seafarers to become an engineering officer: or
  - .2 The possession of a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Engineering;
  - .3 Attendance to an approved Competency Course.
  - .4 Must provide evidence of being qualified in accordance with STCW Regulation III/1 and the competencies in Table A-III/1.
  - .5 Must provide evidence of completion of all necessary approved mandatory modular courses, including:
    - .1 Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boats, other than Fast Rescue Boats (PSCRB)
    - .2 Medical First Aid (MFA)
    - .3 Advanced Fire Fighting (AFF)
    - .4 Engine Resource Management
    - .5 Leadership and Teamwork
    - .6 Security awareness training
    - .7 Training in High Voltage Systems<sup>1</sup>
    - .8 Marine Environmental Awareness
  - .6 Must demonstrate a good command of spoken and written English.
  - .7 Must provide a Medical Examination report that complies with paragraph 2.9.3 above.
  - .8 Must provide a Continuous Discharge Certificate (CDC) or Seafarer Identification and Record Book (SIRB) as proof of sea service.
  - .9 Must provide a passport as proof of identity and nationality.









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#### 3.4.4 Second Engineer Officer)

A candidate for this examination in addition to the requirements in sub-paragraph 3.3.3 above must provide evidence, while holding a PISR-issued Certificate as OICEW, or a foreign certificate in equivalent grade, of:

- .1 at least one (1) year of service as OICEW
- .2 Leadership and Managerial training in lieu of Leadership and Teamwork training.

#### 3.4.5 Chief Engineer

A candidate for this examination in addition to the requirements in sub-paragraph 3.3.3 above must provide evidence, while holding an PISR Certificate as First Assistant Engineer, or a foreign certificate in equivalent grade, of:

- .1 at least one (1) year of service as Second Engineer Officer; or
- .2 at least three (3) years of service as OICEW
- .3 Leadership and Managerial training in lieu of Leadership and Teamwork training.

The CoC for Candidates who do not have experience or training in high voltage systems will be limited so as not to be valid for vessels with high voltage systems. High voltage is considered to be systems over 1000 volts power.

#### All Grades - Steam 3.4.6

Candidates for steam endorsements must provide evidence of at least one (1) year of sea service required within the five (5) years preceding the date of application. The candidate must also provide evidence of sea service on steam vessels in a comparable capacity and for at least six (6) months. The certificated service must have been served while holding a steam certificate.


### Steam and Motor Certificates

A candidate who meets the requirements for examination for steam and motor certificates will be examined in both areas, and if successfully complete the examinations, will be issued a certificate for service with no limitation to propulsion type.

#### 3.4.7 **Propulsion Power Validity**

Certificates issued pursuant to section 3.4. shall be valid for service on vessels of any power unless sea service on vessels over 3000 kW cannot be provided. In that case the CoC shall be issued limited in kW propulsion power.









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#### 3.5 Additional Examination & Training Requirements

#### 3.5.1 Proof of Experience

## .1 Acceptable Documentation

In addition to complying with the general requirements of section 2.6. shall submit satisfactory proof of sea service and experience covering at least the period required for eligibility to sit that examination. Seafarer's books, certificates of service, forms of discharge and other documents certifying the amount and character of experience, and identifying the vessels on which served, shall be examined as to their authenticity and any indication of unauthorized alteration or other invalidity shall render such documents unacceptable.

Proof of sea service can be satisfactorily established by providing a copy of the candidate's official Seafarer's (discharge) book. For certification of service aboard PISR flagged vessels. the candidate must provide a copy of the candidate's Seafarer's Identification and Record Book or an official certificate of service.

### .2 Graduation Certificates

A candidate claiming graduation from a recognized naval, nautical, marine engineering or radio school in lieu of sea service shall be required to submit a certified copy or other facsimile of the candidate's certificate of graduation or of course completion, and a certified translation into English if such certificate is in a foreign language.

#### 3.5.2 **Evidence of Foreign Certificate**

A candidate who holds a foreign certificate and who is applying for examination for a PISR issued Certificate in an equal or higher grade is required to submit with the application satisfactory proof of the foreign Certificate. Such proof may be an official duplicate or a certified copy. Candidates should not send originals of any seafarer documentation.

#### 3.5.3 Surrender of Old Certificate

A successful candidate for examination in a higher grade than the PISR-issued Certificate presently held shall surrender the old PISR-issued Certificate to the Administration upon issuance of the new certificate.

#### 3.5.4 **English Language Proficiency**

All examinations will be administered in the English language. Candidates for engineer officers only may use language translators while taking the examination.









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#### 3.6 **Application Procedure**

#### 3.6.1 How to Apply

Every candidate for examination for an officer certificate shall submit a properly completed application and shall indicate where and when they would like to take the examination.

#### 3.6.2 Days and Places of Examination

Examinations can be taken at selected PISR branch offices or at an examination center that is approved by the Administration. Examinations are normally be conducted on weekdays from 0900 hours to 1700 hours daily. However, the time for conducting the examination may differ depending on the individual facility conducting the examination.

#### 3.7 Subject Matter of Examinations

#### 3.7.1 **Guideline Publications**

Specimen examination questions for each certificate grade are available on the PISR official website. Each Guideline publication includes examination subjects for each certificate grade in accordance with the STCW Code requirements, sample questions, a list of materials that will be available for use by the candidate in the examination room, and a study bibliography.

#### 3.7.2 List of Examination Guidelines

- Deck Officer Yachts
- **Engineer Officer**

#### 3.8 **Conduct of Examinations**

#### 3.8.1 Conduct of Examination; Authorized Tables, Publications and Equipment

- Candidates for examination shall not be allowed to have in their possession any .1 equipment, material, books, notes or other literature except as provided for the candidate by the examination facility;
- .2 Candidates may use an English-foreign language translator or dictionary, which may be taken into the examination space provided that such dictionary is also first inspected by the proctor for unauthorized notes and loose papers. Electronic language translators must also be examined by the proctor.
- Candidates may also provide and utilize their own Rude star finder and non-.3 programmable calculator. Navigational calculators are not allowed.
- .4 Certain portions of the refresher examinations for certificate renewal are open book. Candidates may avail themselves of materials provided at the test center for that portion of the examination only.









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.5 Candidates must turn off all electronic communication devices, and other devices that could be used for photography, and surrender them to the proctor prior to the start of the examination.

#### Unauthorized Persons and Communication are Forbidden 3.8.2

No unauthorized persons shall be permitted to enter the examination space. No candidate for a Certificate shall be permitted to communicate in any manner with any unauthorized person(s) during the taking of an examination. The candidate shall not be given any assistance by a proctor in the answering of examination questions.

#### 3.8.3 Personal Conduct

Each candidate for an examination shall conform to the requirements of the examination facility and shall always maintain absolute silence during the conduct of examinations. Each candidate is required to take care not to mark or otherwise abuse provided publications, equipment and furniture and shall not remove any such items from the examination facility. Candidates are expected to conduct themselves in a polite and professional manner. Misconduct may result in the candidate being expelled from the examination room. Such an occurrence will be deemed as failing the examination.

#### 3.8.4 Work Materials

In answering the examination questions where the use of a work sheet is required, work must be shown and labeled. Answers are to be neatly marked on the answer sheets provided. Computations and scratch-work sheets shall be attached to the answer sheets to which they apply and must not be taken from the examination room.

#### 3.8.5 Penalty

Any candidate who receives unauthorized assistance, makes use of any unauthorized material, or does not in any other way comply with the foregoing process during the examination will be disqualified from proceeding further and shall forfeit all fees paid. Candidates failing under these circumstances will not be eligible for re-examination for a period of six (6) months.

### 3.8.6 Failure to Complete Examination

Any candidate who commences an examination but fails to complete it within the prescribed period, or who otherwise fails to finish all required tests, shall not be entitled to a refund of any examination fees paid by him except when the failure to complete the examination is the responsibility of the administering authority.









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#### 3.9 Re-examinations

#### 3.9.1 Passing Grade

The passing grade for nearly all examinations is 70%.

Waiting Period:

A candidate who does not pass the examination may not be re-examined earlier than 30 days from notification of failure and may not be re-examined more than twice in 12 months.

#### 3.9.2 **Reviewing Examination Papers:**

The score of an examination can be reviewed upon written request to the Administration by the examinee. The score awarded after a review shall be final.

#### 3.10 Revocation

All PISR certificates are the property of the Administrator. They must be in either the possession of the seafarer to whom they are issued, the Administrator, or en-route to the seafarer.

Any CoC may be revoked at any time by the Administrator upon the grounds indicated below:

- 1. Incompetency:
- 2. Physical or mental disability;
- 3. Habitual drunkenness;
- 4. Willful failure to comply with the provisions set forth in any national or international rule or regulation.
- 5. Criminal conduct and any other conduct, which is incompatible with proper performance of duties and obligations during service on board a ship.

In any such case, a marine administrative proceeding shall be held for the determination regarding the temporary or permanent revocation of a PISR issued CoC.

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

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
